Why Study Addiction Studies at EWU?

Addiction Studies (ADST) is an approved education provider with NAADAC, the Association for Addiction Professionals. ADST courses expose students to the multiple demands of working in a treatment agency that can be transferred to other work environments. The main focus of our Interdisciplinary Bachelor of Arts degree is to provide students the educational requirements to prepare them for Washington state certification as Chemical Dependency Professionals. Students who complete all state required courses for certification are eligible to take the NAADAC Exam before completing other state requirements.

Other Degree Options

The ADST Counseling & Prevention minor is designed especially to provide students with the foundation knowledge required to be successful as treatment or prevention providers. Students can choose to add the additional courses, required by the state (approximately 15 credits), in order to complete the educational requirements for the State of WA Chemical Dependency Professionals credential.

Career Opportunities

Addiction Studies (ADST) provides university-level education valuable for students in a variety of disciplines such as Counseling, Criminal Justice, Health Education, Psychology and Social Work, among others, and can also enhance effectiveness in personal and career endeavors. Employers are especially eager to hire students with a foundation in Addiction Studies coursework as a part of their major expertise.

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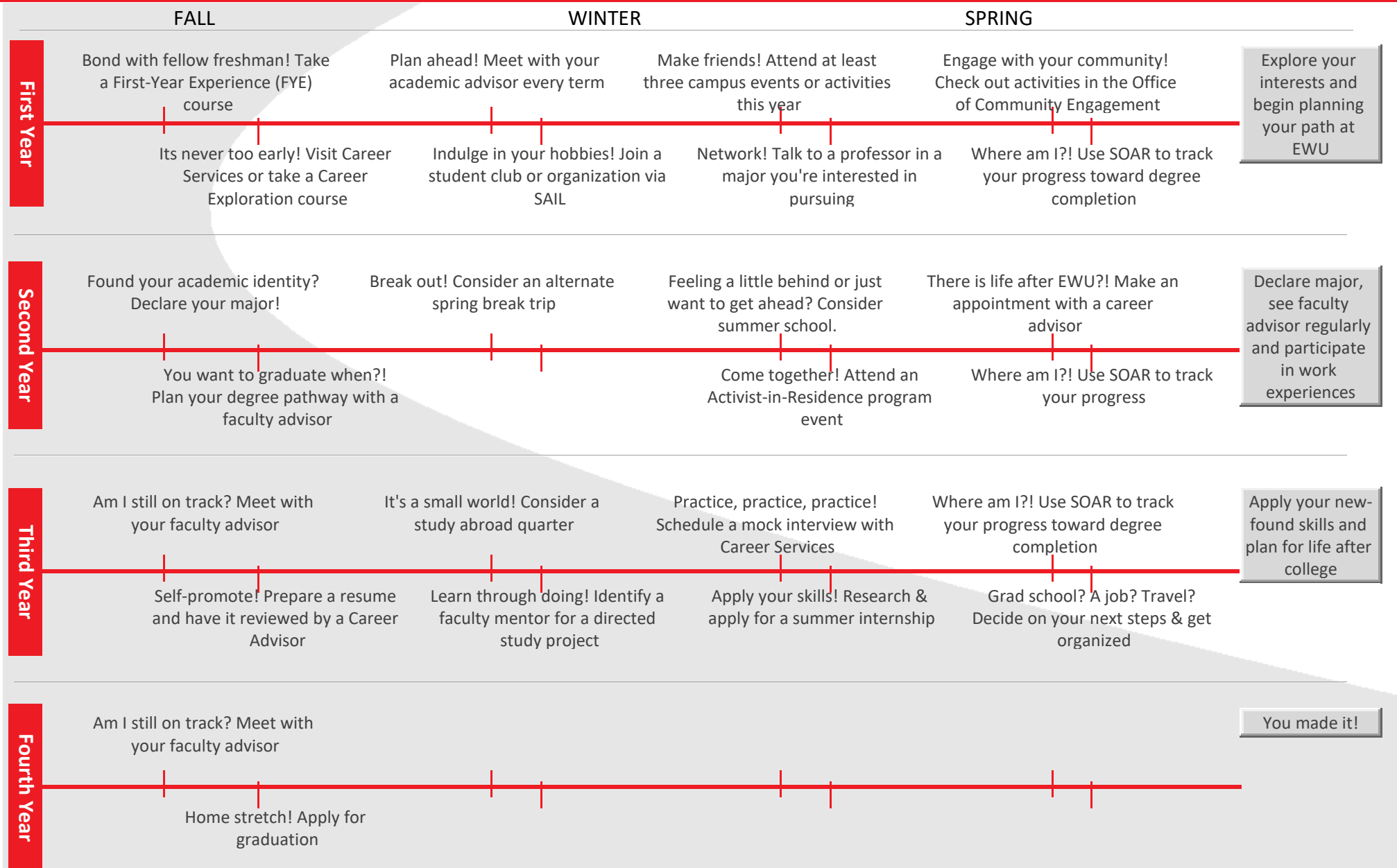
