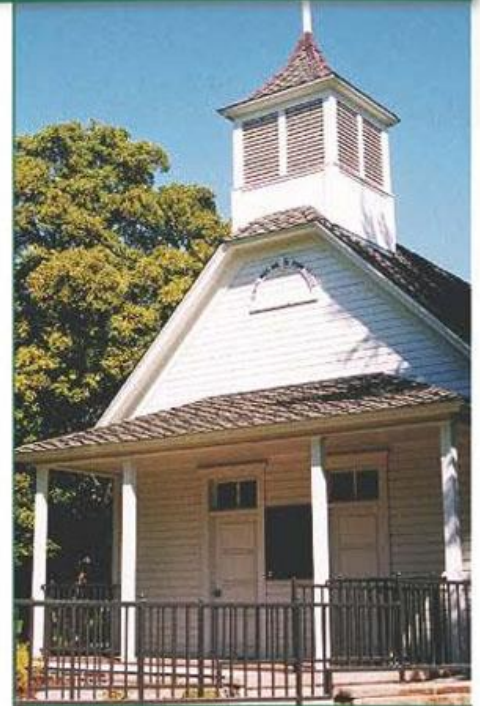
Why study Recreation and Tourism Management?
