Why study economics?

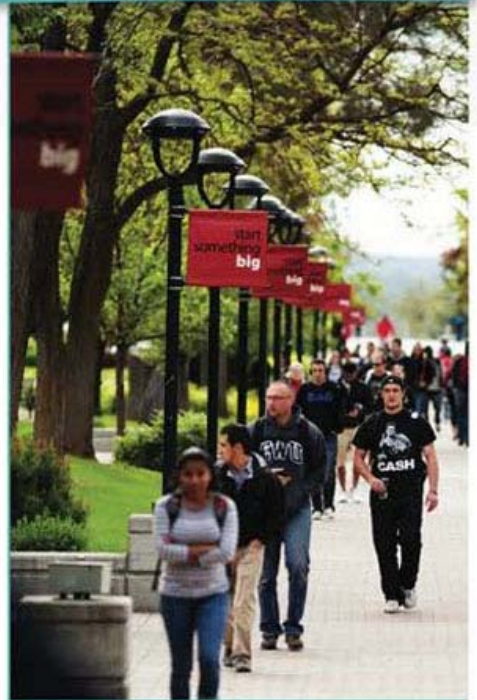
