Why study Literacy Education?

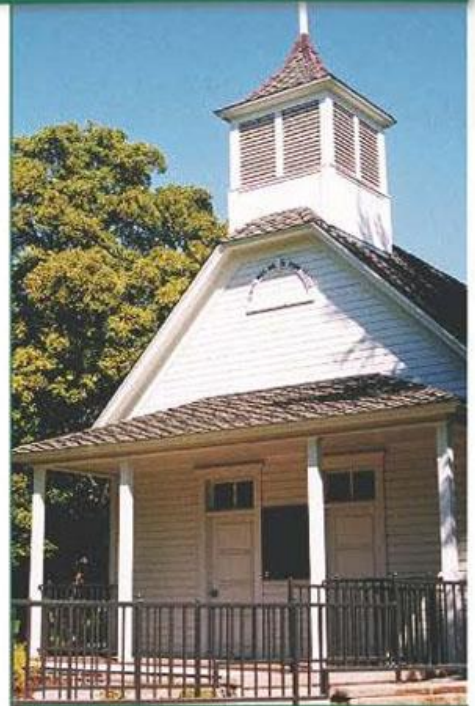
