- *Public Historian:* using techniques to analyze blueprints, archival material, and even the buildings themselves, public historians interpret historical meanings in a cityscape.
- *High School (or secondary) Educator:* historians in this field generally teach humanities courses (psychology, economics, geography, history) to children 12-18. Differing from earlier stages, these educators are able to lay out more conceptually complex interpretations of history, most often linking the material to the current period.
- *Archivist:* storing, organizing, maintaining, and making additions to a surplus of records, archivists apply historical technique to discern which material is relevant and where it belongs, also acting as a resource for those who seek the information they're responsible for.

- *Documentary Filmmaker:* amassing information (footage) from experts and weaving in primary source material, documentarians apply historical training for historical accuracy.
