



# COLLEGE ASSISTANCE MIGRANT PROGRAM

## ABOUT C.A.M.P.

The College Assistance Migrant Program is a federally funded program designed to support students from migrant and seasonal farm worker backgrounds during their first year of college. The program provides students with financial assistance and support services, with the goal of preparing them to continue their education at a four-year college or university.

### Financial Assistance

Quarterly stipend and access to a lending library, in addition to the services offered at Eastern Washington University.

### Academic Advising

CAMP staff works with students to ensure they are taking appropriate coursework and attending full time each term.

### Mentoring and Tutoring

Students are assigned a peer mentor as a resource during their experience as a first-time college student. Also, students have EWU resources available to help them with school assignments.

### Conference Participation

CAMP scholars have the opportunity to attend statewide and national conferences to further their leadership, networking and empowerment.

### Parental Involvement

CAMP values families/guardians and involves them in each student's college experience through various events throughout the school year.

## BE A PART OF EWU CAMP

### Who qualifies for CAMP?

- High school graduates (or equivalent) with a 2.5 GPA or better
- Be eligible to apply for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Be a U.S. citizen or resident

### How do I apply?

- Submit CAMP application (print version or online)
- Apply for FAFSA as early as October 1st
- Apply for EWU admission and take placement tests
- Meet with EWU advisors and CAMP staff to begin class registration

### Maintaining Eligibility

- Take a minimum of 12 credits per term
- Register for CAMP required courses
- Meet with a CAMP mentor on a regular basis
- Obtain course progress notifications (CPNs) from teachers
- Meet with CAMP retention specialist at least three times per quarter
- Maintain a minimum 2.75 GPA or better
- Attend CAMP events throughout the academic year
