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## Needle Stick/Bodily Fluids Exposure Procedures

If you are stuck with a needle or exposed to bodily fluids, it is important that you complete the following:

- 1. Clean the affected area for 15 minutes.
- 2. Assess the exposure:
  - Did anything pierce your skin?
  - Did body fluids splash on a mucous membrane (i.e.eyes, ears, nose, mouth)?
  - Is the skin broken around the exposure area?
- 3. Immediately report the incident to your supervisor. If it was a needle stick, get a picture of the needle if possible.
  - The supervisor should complete an incident report immediately
- 4. Go to the Emergency room or urgent care clinic immediately.
  - Tell the medical provider you had potential bloodborne pathogen exposure at work.

If you refuse immediate follow-up treatment, it is required that you sign the <u>Informed Refusal for Medical Evaluation Form</u> (EH&S Form). The supervisor must sign this form and send a copy to EH&S.
