Teacher Identity Group Interview

Directions:

- A. Each person in the group will take on each of the roles throughout this process.
 - 1. Interviewee—This person will answer questions about his/her experiences in order to explore how their identity affects who they are as a teacher.
 - 2. Interviewer—This person will ask the questions to the Interviewee and listen carefully for themes that emerge, key concepts, etc.
 - 3. Notetaker—This person will listen carefully and take notes during the interview, noting inconsistencies, themes that emerge, key concepts, etc.
- B. Each person should brainstorm answers to the following questions:
- 1. What is one important aspect of your identity? What does this aspect reveal about you personally or professionally?
- 2. Imagine an example of when this aspect might arise in your teaching. Describe this instance.
- 3. Describe how this example was (could be) either positive or negative for yourself, your students, and/or your classroom atmosphere.
- 4. What could you do in your classroom or teaching practice to use this aspect of your identity as a strength?
- C. After the each person has completed EACH of the roles, we will have some time to discuss what you've noticed-as a small group and as a whole group.
