EWU ROTC CONTRACTS 10 CADETS INTO THE U.S. ARMY AT HISTORIC SHOWALTER HALL

On Sept. 20, 2018, the Eastern Washington University Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program contracted 10 cadets into the U.S. Army. The Army ROTC contracting ceremony was held on the eastside grounds of Showalter Hall, which is the oldest building on EWU's campus. Showalter Hall was built in 1915 when EWU was a teachers' college. College of Social Sciences Dean Jonathan Anderson, CSS Business Officer Bill Shaw, Veterans Resource Center Director Dave Millet, Veterans Resource Center Benefits Supervisor/School Certifying Official Lena Tanquay, and fellow cadets, alumni, friends and family, attended the contracting ceremony. Contracting cadets recited the Oath of Enlistment given to them by Lt. Col. Jonathan Stafford, the professor of military science and department chair for the EWU ROTC program. An Act of Congress on Sept. 29, 1789 approved the first Oath of Enlistment under the Constitution. It applied to all commissioned officers, noncommissioned officers and enlisted soldiers in the United States military.
