 - i) Athletics 2:15pm
 - (1) Bill Chaves & Chad C. & Felix V. presenting
 - (2) Where does the funding go and how much does each sport receive?
 - (a) Breakdown for each sport and their funding's

- (i) Solid public expenses broken down
- (ii) Team travel, equipment supplies, operating expenses, game expenses, marketing, guarantees- all allowed in S&A fee. Visual showing the previous year's expenses done
- (iii) Game expenses is pertaining to officials hired for games
- (iv) Recruiting is mostly traveling expenses to or from Cheney
- (b) Travel is \$1.3mil
 - (i) Track, field, football, soccer, basketball, tennis, volleyball, golf
 - (ii) Football travel expenses is smaller because of revenue coming in
 - (iii) Non-sport specific travel: business operations, for all student athletes
- (c) \$681,000 for supplies
 - (i) most amount is spent on football teams athletic uniforms and safety
 - (ii) non-sport specific is pertaining to athletic training
- (d) \$260,000 for student wages
 - (i) all non-sport specific are benefitting all sports teams
- (e) \$25,000 one-time marketing fee
 - (i) benefits all of the sports teams
 - (ii) we pay them to broadcast games which that wasn't budgeted for
- (iii) advertising of other sports games on there as well
- (3) What is the benefit to all EWU students?
 - (a) Employment opportunities & professional development
 - (i) Game/practice operations, equipment room, marketing/social media, academics/tutors, athletic training, strength training, admin.
 - (b) Social impact (games, matches, events, etc.)
 - (i) Pay for student playoff tickets out of foundation accounts
 - (c) Opportunities for other student groups (Adidas)
 - (i) Adidas allows 50% off MSRP was just approved in November
 - (ii) Provide an index number to allow clubs to purchase apparel
 - (d) Performance of athletic teams

- (i) Feel proud that student athletes are working hard
- (ii) Athletics has over 3.0 GPA, have won Conference Presidents' Cup (academic award).
- **(4)** Why is this funding essential to athletics and allocated in this manner?
 - (a) S&A is one of three funding branches to this program. the three branches are:
 - (i) Institutional support (actual dollars from institution or indirect costs: lighting, etc.)
 - (ii) Student fees
 - **1.** Student fees: EWU is at \$2,266,000 which is 43rd out of 71 schools
 - 2. Per student per year fee from EWU: \$224 (From 2014 year)
 - (iii) Generated Revenues (fundraising, tickets, etc.)
 - 1. Self-supported is if you can generate a revenue
 - a. No schools have self-supporting budget
 - i. We are 30.60% self-sufficient
 - (b) Asking for increase to \$2.5 million
 - (i) Generated revenues- tickets, fundraising, and camps
 - **1.** Revenue has increased by 123% since 2010
 - 2. tickets sales increase, and fundraising increase
- (5) How much funding is being requested this year and for what purpose?
 - (a) Asking for increase of \$234,000
 - (b) Increase student employment to: \$90,000
 - (c) Increase travel to \$50,000
 - (d) Net increase in supplies and marketing: \$94,000
 - (i) Outsourcing corporate deals, taking out the one-time fee of \$25,000
 - (ii) Using a different company for marketing
 - (e) Student wages:
 - (i) Looking at that to increase from \$283,069 to 325,000 and to increase in the following years
 - **(f)** Team travel:
 - (i) Increase because of where the teams need to be traveling to.

- 1. When North Dakota leaves the Big Sky in 2019 there is a hope to not increase travel expenses since there will not be any expenses to travel to North Dakota.
- (ii) Most schools are not in distance that can be traveled to by bus, so flying is needed to travel to these schools
- (g) Supplies and equipment
 - (i) Stayed relatively constant
 - Costs were down last year but seeing an increase this year and the following years

 - 1. student employment, travel, then increase in supplies
 - **2.** Would be expecting to generate revenue to offset it
 - (iii) Athletics is 30% of generated fundraising for EWU
 - (c) How many student employees are there?
 - (i) 90-120 employees
 - **(d)** In terms of how much we is allocated to Athletics, how much covers students game attendance?
 - (i) Committee asks presenters to look at attendance figures from ticketed games, if students don't take advantage of it, if they are allowed to attend games
 - (ii) Look at opportunity costs
 - (iii) Have presenters send data to Mikey on Friday April 21st
 - (e) Base revenues on percentages?
 - (i) Set percentage of total revenue possible?

 - (d) How much money is being asked?
 - (i) Airfare flying from Texas and Denver is what is short on the funding
 - (ii) \$750 total airfare short
 - 1. \$750-\$1000 estimated
 - (iii) Have been given \$3,000 from ASEWU & can have a conversation about looking into the rest of \$1,000 from ASEWU
 - (2) 40th anniversary (\$25,000)
 - (a) want to show students what they can do with a Chicano/Chicana studies minor
 - (b) This will be through lectures, workshops, art exhibit
 - (c) want to promote inclusivity, diversity, and show what a minor can give to students
 - (d) Total amount goes towards?
 - (i) Week-long event: community gatherings (open to all students), lectures, etc.
 - (e) Are there performances aside from workshops and lectures?
