#### 5) New Business

- a) Presentations
  - i) Sheila Music 2:30
- Guest Artists: Music Education and performances at noon on Wednesdays
- Give a music lesson then a full performance with Q&A at the end
- Would like to bring groups open to the community not just music students
- Music Tours: have ensembles travel to different schools to show students their group and answer questions to high school students
- Recruiting for potential students at EWU
- Equipment:
- Have to make sure their instruments are tuned
- Transportation of instruments
- Using up to date equipment teaches students how to use equipment they are going to be using when they enter the field
- Sounds/looks better and helps students put their best foot forward when performing
- Competitions: represent EWU on a broader scale
- Had a student representing eastern at a large conference where he was one of 5 students chosen, all of which all the students went to top schools in the nation.
  - The music department could not pay for him get to the conference completely
  - o Want to help Eastern as a whole, not all musicians are music majors
- Festivals:
- Jazz- 1,000 high school students on campus
  - o Three concerts throughout the week to showcase all their different ensembles
- Over 100 performances each year in the music building
- Students enter for free
- Every Wednesday at noon

#### Questions:

- Have you looked at other ways to fund conferences? ASEWU?
  - Can't get funding unless presenting or performing, not just learning about the music

## Marching Band

- Biggest audience out of all ensembles because they perform at all games and if our athletics continues to succeed they are shown on a national level
- o Uniforms
- Typically don't fit the students correctly because students are their tailors, not professionals
- o Equipment
- Staff of 7 people: visual instructor, music director, two drill writers, color guard instructor, etc.
- Instrument upkeep/ tuning
- Upkeep happens more often because they didn't have enough money to purchase better equipment
- o Fly like an eagle day- when high school students come to see the band
- O Day before a game where the marching band goes on the field with high school students and work with them
- o High school students play fly like an eagle with the marching band
- o They don't get lunch together though
- Providing lunch would allow more conversation between high school and collegiate members
- This is a class, but they have to be there during the summer to prepare for football games
- o Can't help students with outside costs before school starts
- o Questions:
- o Why did the president stop funding this?
- o President paid for base dollars but not the extra \$47,000
- o If not fully funded they wouldn't be able to perform on the field for halftime shows, tailgates, pep rallies, etc.
- o Fly like an eagle day? Please elaborate on mentoring
- This day allows students that are not music education majors to teach kids
- o The money funded wouldn't go towards revenues
- What other places of revenues in your department have you looked towards?
- o The only place they get revenue is from the marching band, so there is nothing extra
- o Don't charge for concerts because attendance gets low
- o Typically don't get asked to perform for income either

- Provide services to the school already for free by performing whenever necessary.
- o Ex.) Presidents' inauguration, diversity week, etc.

#### • Kevin-EPIC 3:00

- Create/expand programming
- Need more funds to not only do this but maintain services
- o Climbing Wall
- o Is now separate from EPIC, they have to contact them for services instead of having direct access
- o Professional staff
- o Have had a shortage of staff because of these contract changes
- Must have a field supervisor for all trips
- Going to have to hire a new field supervisor and add another position to the professional staff
- o Minimum Wage increase
- o All except 2 employees make minimum wage
- Operations wages
- o Have 2 or 3 meetings per quarters
- 16 student employees to separate/ specialize positions
- o Instead of going out into the field for 2-3 days, doing day trips
- Fusion- students haven't been able to register online for trips or rentals previously, so this will eliminate this problem and allow easier booking
- o More stable that current system
- o Equipment
- o Request for a bus
- Most trips have more than 7 people, but their current transportation only allots that much
- o Wants to gradually get more buses
- Their buses go off road so they wear and get old faster
- \$395,269 is the revised budget request to take into account their revenues
- o EPIC is seasonal, so the revenue will depend on the sun/snow
- EPIC is meant to get students out trying things they've never tried at a cheap cost

 EPIC may be really good at outdoor activities, but haven't typically been good at business. Now they have learned to prioritize business and have been working at managing efficiently.

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- o Questions:
- o Spring quarter- backpacking trip actual price? Yes
- O How price sensitive are your students/ do you think they can handle a price increase?
- No according to the loyalty points
- o Sell out certain trips, not all
- Trips schedule a year out, so they don't know if weather will always permit for the trip and if they will sell out or have to cancel

  - i) Club Sports Federation
- 6) Supplemental Proposals- None for this meeting
- 7) Items up for Vote
  - a) We will vote on the decision to increase the S&A Fee
    - Discussion:
    - Should we increase the fee at all?
    - Minimum Wage Increase
    - Discussion on legislative decisions on fee reduction
    - Want to be fiscally responsible
    - Want to service the students wants/needs
    - With the decrease in student enrollment, we need to vote on at least a 2% increase to receive the same amount of money we had this year
    - Discussion on programs free to students at EWU vs. other universities
      - Jaime motioned for the S&A Fee to increase by 10%
      - Motion was seconded by Elizabeth Shimamoto
    - Discussion on the motion
      - Most cost effective school in Washington while already providing these services
      - These dollars go towards providing the enriching activities to students outside of academics
      - This money is for serving students, so increasing the fee isn't intending to hurt them
      - Activities are what keeps students engaged at EWU

- The impact if we don't raise it to 10% we aren't getting the funding for things students want/need like the multicultural center, athletics, etc. or fund new programs students are asking for as well.
- Brock motioned to vote
  - All in favor for the 10% increase: 7 for, 0 against, 0 abstain

## 8) Other Business

- Chicana/Chicano Studies- coming back to present on two separate proposals not relating to the previous proposal
- Previously approved \$40,000 for music program student wages for FY17, received \$20,288 back because the request was invalid. \$19,722 is what actually went through.
- Pride Center- needs another staff member to continue functioning, so keep this in mind for next meeting
