Tim Collins currently serves as Fresno State's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Development. He is a member of the Athletics Department's Executive Staff that implements strategic direction, establishes academic and compliance standards, ensures equity, fosters inclusion, defines budget expectations, and promotes student-athlete welfare for 18 NCAA Division I varsity programs. Collins brings more than 18 years of professional experience working in intercollegiate athletics both in fundraising and as a college basketball coach.

Starting with the Bulldogs in 2018, Collins is currently responsible for leading and managing all revenue development and fundraising activities for the Department of Athletics, including supervision of fundraising initiatives in the Bulldog Foundation. The Bulldog Foundation is a non-profit organization responsible for raising funds to support student-athlete scholarships, capital projects and other initiatives supporting Fresno State student-athletes. He also serves as the sport administrator for Women's Basketball and Men's and Women's Golf.

Since 2018, Fresno State Athletics has set the 4 highest annual fund membership records. Additionally, Fresno State Athletics recently unveiled a \$250M+ facility master plan.

Prior to Fresno State he served as the Associate Athletics Director for Development at the University of Wyoming. While at Wyoming from 2013 to 2018, Collins was an integral part in raising the necessary resources for many capital improvement projects, elevating the annual fund, and enhancing the student-athlete experience at Wyoming. He played a role in several capital improvement projects including but not limited to the construction and implementation of \$30M worth of renovations to the Arena-Auditorium, fundraising for locker room renovations for the volleyball and track & field programs, and lastly, the fundraising, planning and construction for the \$44M Mick & Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center.

Collins began his professional career at the collegiate level in 2005-06 as the Director of Basketball Operations at Cal State Fullerton. Collins then moved up to an assistant coaching position at Chadron State College in Nebraska from 2006-08. From 2008-10, Collins was an assistant coach at Lewis-Clark State College in Lewiston, Idaho. During his years at Lewis-Clark, he also served as an instructor in the kinesiology department, teaching classes on sports administration and coaching theory among other areas.

He moved to Black Hills State as an assistant basketball coach in 2010 and began making the move into an athletic administrative role during his time in Spearfish, eventually being promoted to the position of Assistant Athletics Director for Development and Fundraising in 2011. While at Black Hills State University, the Yellow Jackets completed over \$1M in renovations to Lyle Hare Stadium, including the installation of new artificial turf and the construction of a new video board.

Collins currently serves on the executive committee member for the National Association for Athletic Development Directors, an affiliate of NACDA.

Collins received his bachelor's degree in humanities, with an emphasis in political science, from Loyola Marymount in May 2005. He completed a master's degree in organizational management and sport administration from Chadron State in May 2008.

He and his wife, Renee, have a nine-year-old daughter, Kennedy, and a seven-year-old son, James.
